

Mass, prayed the Rosary, completed community service projects, competed in athletics, put on a drama production, went on retreat, and attended classes. We also welcomed new faculty and a new Pastor, Father Tom Lilly. In May 2017, 13 members of the Class of 2017 joined the ranks of over 200 Lumen graduates. These fine young men and women have a worldview centered on the teachings of lesus Christ, are servant leaders, strive to serve others before self, and respect the value and dignity of others as made in God's image and likeness.




Tuition Comparison in Anchorage






Community Service Program
