Students, faculty, staff, and friends joined for "Field Day"- a chance to "blow off steam" prior to the start of final exams. Adults won the kickball game!



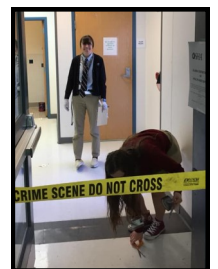
