School Is In Session



Lumen Christi High School's new home is located at 750 E. Fireweed Lane.

After a year and a half of planning, searching and wondering if it was really possible, Lumen Christi High School opened its doors on Sept. 3 to students in grades 7 through 10. Grade 11 will commence in the fall of 1997, followed by grade 12 the next year.

The school was founded by members of the Archdiocese who recognized a growing need for quality education within the context of the Catholic value system.

A steering committee was formed, and working with representatives of the Archdiocese, a series of public meetings were held. The meetings led to a city-wide parish survey to determine the priorities of the Catholic community. The overwhelming response confirmed the communities support for a Catholic Jr/Sr High School.

After considerable searching, a site was located in late May and work began in earnest. Building renovation, curriculum development, the hiring of staff, all took place in a few short months.

Archbishop Hurley Presides at Dedication & Blessing

Teachers, board members, parents and community members were on hand Oct. 23 to celebrate Archbishop Francis T. Hurley's blessing of Lumen Christi High School.

A reception followed, that provided guests an opportunity to tour the facility and meet the staff.

Lesson #1: HOW TO START A SCHOOL!

Construction Zone – Miracle in progress! Just 7 short months after the board gave its go-ahead, Lumen Christi High School opened its doors to students. Despite the tight schedule and a mountain of insurmountable obstacles, solutions miraculously appeared, and the dream of a new Catholic Jr./Sr. High School in Anchorage became a reality.

A three-month search to find housing for the school ended in May with the discovery of the Anchor Building in mid-town. Located at 750 E. Fireweed Lane, the Anchor Building provided ample space in a convenient location. The owner, a strong supporter of Catholic education offered a generous lease agreement which included snow removal and trash pickup. Since the building was not located in an area zoned for schools, the Planning and Zoning Commission approved a change in the zoning ordinances to allow schools and other educational programs and businesses in B-3 zones. This process, which can take up to a year, flew through in just two

Next, the Physical Plant Committee went into action. **GDM Architects** and **RSA Engineering** assisted the committee in finalizing an economical design that best utilized the space and met 1996 Municipal Building Code requirements for schools. Major renovation of the inside of the building was required!


Early August saw an enthusiastic cadre of parents, boards members, spouses and other community members joining together as a demolition crew, followed by carpenters, who finished framing in a quick three days. Board members then began installing insulation, taping, mudding and picking up loose ends. Soon after,

the electricians were on site to work on lights, phones and computer lines.

Just as the building was being completed, much needed donations came in: desks, chalkboards, art supplies, and computers were added to the numerous fixtures and supplies garnered throughout the summer.

Finishing touches were still being added as the September 3 opening grew near. Despite the phenomenal effort, it was time for Plan B: With the blessing of Archbishop Hurley, Fr. LaSalle Hallisey, and the support of Holy Family parishioners, the Education Center at Holy Family Cathedral was offered to temporarily house the school until the Anchor Building was ready. By September 16, just nine days off schedule, all major work and inspections were complete.

This spirit-driven project, which could have cost \$150,000, was accomplished for a fraction of the estimate, thanks to the hard work and prayers of so many. More than 3,300 volunteer hours coupled with the enormous generosity of many area businesses, transformed an idea into a positive learning environment for Catholic Education in Anchorage.
