- a. Archdiocesan Perspective:

- c. Principal's Report:

Brian Ross. As written, and attached. Brian combined his report with the Mission Moment and recap on the first week of school. Brian noted the first week was an exciting and busy time! 35 additional students in the building over last year. Seventh hour during the week (normally used for electives, intensives and for Study Hall) was used instead to conduct safety drills; introduce new Houses, the Big A/little a mentorship program; conduct new server and Extraordinary Minister training and provide "Mass 101" for our non-Catholic students, among many other things. .

d. Mission Moment: Brian Ross. Recap on the first week of school, as above. e. Financial Update/Year End:

Bill Arnold provided an update through the end of the Fiscal Year (June 30, 2023.) Both the Parish and the school had particularly good years. The school ended with a budget surplus of \$131,862.

e. Financial Update/Year End by Project

Marcy Adkins presented the FY 2023 budget by project code which shows a level of income/expense by activity. Marcy highlighted some of the areas to illustrate the level of detail available for review. Fr. Tom noted that all finances are 100% transparent (with the exception of individual staff salaries) and Board members could ask for an accounting of income/expenses at any time. Brian noted the very healthy budget was an extraordinary blessing as he was able to distribute over \$101k in financial aid to 25+ families, who might not otherwise be able to have their children attend Lumen Christi.

Speaker Series October 5, 2023

The October event will feature a presentation of "Screenagers – Under the Influence" - a film which provides a concise but comprehensive overview about the impact of alcohol, marijuana, vaping and other substances on adolescent health with a guided discussion afterwards. This event will be held on October 5th at 7p, here in the Lumen Christi gym. Brian noted that ASD Title IV "Health and Safety" funds will be used to pay the \$700 screening fee. Aaron reiterated for new members that the Speaker Series was a 2x a year event, run through the "Lumen Forward" Committee. Any ideas for future topics should be forwarded to him.

Principal's Report August 2023

A<u>cademics</u>

-We hired three new teachers (Mr. Matt Hemry, Ms. Megan Hauck, and Mrs. Catherine Haslett) to fill our vacant teaching positions and brought back Dr. Antje Carlson for the fall semester since we were unable to find a qualified replacement for her position over the summer.
 -School year is off to a great start! We used the first few days of 7th periods to introduce Big A mentors to their little a mentees, conduct altar server and extraordinary minister training, complete an all school fire drill, hand out spring semester Faith in Action and Academic Awards, and announce student assignments in our House system.
