



School Board Strategic Planning




- Board has updated the Strategic Direction

School Board Advisory Actions



- After Board review in late 2022/early 2023, the school published an Interim Policy on the Use of Public Correspondence School Allotment Funds in March 2023
 - We will not participate in the use of allotment funds to reimburse tuition costs (neither by class nor full)
 - We will not seek to be a vendor for any public correspondence program and we will not provide any curricular materials to these programs directly (parents can submit)
 - We will assist parents in seeking reimbursement for certain "clear and distinct non-tuition" costs including:
 - UAF and North Dakota Center for Distance Education courses
 - Sports and extracurricular fees

A Day in the Life of a Lumen Christi Teacher

5am	Wake up, morning prayer, get self and family ready		
6-6:45am	Leave home to head to school (leave earlier for those that drop off children at daycare or preschool)		
6:45-7:30am	Arrive school. Getting classroom ready and reviewing days lessons and activities. Students begin arriving at 7am so most of this time is spent greeting and talking with students until the bell rings		
7:30-7:34am	Meet with grade level advisory (attendance, Pledge, Prayer and		

spent greeting and talking with students and fellow staff)
7:35-8:20am Period 1 (High school science core course)(16 students)
8:25-9:10am Period 2 (Planning)(plan lessons, answer parent emails, n

Morning Announcements)

Period 2 (Planning)(plan lessons, answer parent emails, meet with administration and other teachers, **sub for absent teachers**)

(once 7:34am bell rings, only 5 minutes between classes—mainly

9:15-10am Period 3 (Junior high math core course)(14 students)

10:05-10:50am	Period 4 (High school science core course-different from Period 1)(15 students)
10:51-11:14am	23 minute lunch! (Time actually spent supervising gym activities or lunch detention)
11:15-12:00pm	Period 5 (Junior or High school Theology)(26 students)
12:05-12:50pm	Period 6 (Junior High science core course)(12 students)
12:51-1pm	Grade level advisory (celebrate birthdays, discuss schedule for week, go over study skills/time management)
1:05-2pm	Supervise study hall (set up by House)(answer student questions, administer make up tests for absent students, etc.)
2pm	Dismissal! Students done for the day, but teachers are not.

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Time	Activity
2 1nm	Parent toacher conferences, team moetings, mont

Parent-teacher conferences, team meetings, mentoring meetings, **Z-4**pm lesson planning, parent emails and phone calls, grading. Contract says 3pm, but most teachers at school long after contract time.

Arrive home after picking up kids from daycare or school and spend time with family (hopefully).

Back at Lumen to watch basketball/attend event or at home being a 6-10pm parent while also making phone calls, sending emails, lesson planning, posting assignments to Google Classroom, grading and entering grades in PowerSchool. **If Sunday night, review weekly schedule and prepare for the week.

***If attending Lumen event, do all of this after getting back home. Check in with spouse and family, go to bed, and get ready to do it all 10pm-12am over again tomorrow. Mind doesn't stop thinking about what you have to do for our important mission and what is going on in Student X life or Student Y's family, so fall asleep praying for our students and community.


- All serve at least one additional duty as well
 - Ms. Brewer: Dean of Academics, Math/Science Dept Chair, IT Representative, 12th Grade Advisor, and Registrar
 - Others: NHS Advisor, Big A/little a Advisor, Theology Dept Chair, House Advisors, Grade Advisors, Mentor Teachers
- Number of hours per contract (7am-3pm) = 40/week
- Number of hours actually worked = 65-70/week
- Average salary is <u>75-80</u>% what ASD teachers earn



Staff Professional Development







- Two staff members to NCEA 2024
- Five staff members participating in nationally recognized, online professional development on strengthening student learning in block scheduling



Final Thoughts About Our Staff



- Take time to read course syllabus and/or teacher email updates (a lot of the answers to your questions are there)
- Expect at least one grade a week per class
- Reach out with questions, but don't expect an immediate response (w/i 24 hours, unless emergency)
- Parent teacher conferences should last 8-9 minutes; anything longer should be scheduled after school on Tues or Wed
- "Too much homework!" = child most likely not using in-class provided work time and/or study hall (4x/week)
- Meetings and correspondence should be "Christ-like" (cordial and professional)

Academic Honesty Expectations



- Policy located in our Parent/Student Handbook
 - Cheating/plagiarism prevent honest assessment of student progress, conceals academic weaknesses, and unfair to others
- "3 Strikes" policy; remediation program after "Strike 2"
- Common mistakes include:
 - Not reading assignment thoroughly or not using rubric
 - Using Artificial Intelligence (AI) to "enhance" and "improve" writing a.k.a. "making me sound smarter"
 - Procrastinating and not asking a teacher
- Reviewed policy with all students first week in January 2024 (along with common scenarios)



Academic Honesty Scenario



Billy's Dad looks over Billy's US History essay to help him proofread it. Dad asks to sit behind the computer and begins correcting and editing Billy's work and even rewrites portions to make it sound better so Billy can get an A. Is this academic dishonesty?

Appropriate Response: This is academic dishonesty. There is a difference between proofreading and rewriting. Proofreading and offering suggestions is OK. Writing or rewriting for another person is not. Having a parent/peer/sibling/friend or Al complete work on your behalf or enhance/improve/enrich your writing is a violation of Lumen Christi's policy.

Academic Honesty Scenario



Josie has to write a three-page paper for her US Literature class on the book 1984. She reads the book entirely, taking notes in a separate journal as she reads. She writes the paper in her own words using these notes. In a couple of places in the paper, she provides direct quotes from an online source and paraphrases from another online source. For the direct quote, she uses quotation marks and provides an in-text citation. For the paraphrase, she provides an in-text citation at the end of the sentence. She also adds a reference page in APA format to the end to show all the resources she accessed. She did use spell check in Google Docs to correct spelling errors. Is this academic dishonesty?

Appropriate Response: No. Josie's paper is in her own words. To add credibility and additional evidence to her paper, she added quotes and ideas from other sources, but used APA formatting (quotation marks, in text citations, etc.) to give proper credit and attribution to the sources used. She also included a reference page in APA format. It is ok to use spell/grammar check within Google for Education programs (Docs, Slides, Sheets, etc.) since the school provides this resource.

Movement to Region 2A HS Basketball Fall 2024




- Currently 1A. Previously discussed move to 3A was supported by stakeholders, but plan delayed
- Move would allow for more access to "local" road teams, statewide exposure, and tournament competition.
- Move supported by players and coaches.
- School enrollment growth would most likely result in move to 2A anyway in 2025
- New 2A "Southern Conference" approved by ASAA in Dec. Consists of Su-Valley, Seward, Ninilchik, Unalaska, and Lumen Christi.
- Application submitted to ASAA in January 2024. AD has already attended scheduling meetings
- Start 2A season Dec 2024
